The Deanery of Alcester is at a unique moment in its shared life and purpose. With four benefices vacant we believe that this is a Kairos moment that God is inviting us to think differently about how parish ministry is exercised.

We recognise that ministers come with a range of skills, expertise and callings that could be shared more widely than the benefice which they are serving. Already, the Deanery Chapter is committed to cross-deanery working, as evidenced in our shared Marriage Preparation course, the Deanery Churchwardens' network, and Anna Chaplaincy.

We want to provide further opportunities for working together collaboratively across the deanery, for clergy and laity alike, in order to steward giftings well, learn from one another, and share the joys and burdens of ministry and administration.

We seek four ordained 'Rural Pioneers', each of whom will lead the parish mission and ministry in their own benefice, as well as contributing one or more missional specialisms to the whole deanery. In return they can expect to be able to draw on other colleagues' time and expertise. These giftings are likely to include mission to children and families, schools, older people and youth, as well as discipleship and evangelism. We are trusting that the Holy Spirit will be guiding the right mix of specialisms to the Deanery for this moment, and we are open to having more than one expert in any given field.

Arden Valley: The Arden Valley Group of Churches is made up of five village communities located just north of Stratford on Avon. They share many similarities but have specific talents, needs and ambitions within each of them. We desire to be more inclusive and attractive to newcomers, especially the younger generation whilst continuing to support our older Parishioners.



Beaudesert, Henley-in-Arden & Ullenhall: A thriving market town and rural village; established community links; enthusiastic congregation and lay ministry teams; prayerfully open to progressive change; committed to bringing Jesus Christ into the hearts and minds of every parish household and organisation.



Our Benefices



Churches of Arden: Situated in the historically rich countryside of the Forest of Arden, the Churches of Arden consist of four rural parishes. While the four churches have different yet complementary worship styles, we share the common aim of being a welcoming community, journeying together to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to our villages at large.



Heart of England Benefice: Uniquely in the Deanery, our Benefice offers four church primary schools, six congregations, one associate minister, one family link worker and an administrator - all working together towards our shared vision. We share the beautiful scenery enjoyed by the whole Deanery but we have the river!

Our Benefices

Arden Marches: Large village on the edge of Redditch new town, together with two hamlets and one other village. Four church buildings across two parishes. Investing heavily in children and in older people's ministry, offering a wide range of worship styles and significantly engaged in wider community life.



Alcester Minster: Historic market town and the surrounding ring of villages - eight churches across five parishes. 218 regular Sunday attendance, experiencing growth especially among children and families. Exploring a range of new worshipping communities. Designated as a Mission Hub.

Centred on Alcester Minster, and serving the whole deanery and beyond, the Hub exists to:

Trial new ways of being church with a range of new worshipping communities and events being developed in the Minster.

Share stories and experiences providing a focal point to talk about what is and isn't working in rural situations. As we share stories and listen, these conversations stimulate new thinking and new confidence to try things.

Support rural clergy by providing a place to connect for support, encouragement and ideas. A rural clergy prayer network provides an important lifeline.

Review and take stock through consultancy and support to help rural churches and benefices review their strengths and resources and develop realistic plans to adapt and grow as churches.

Enable creative thinking through praying and sharing and being led by the Holy Spirit in ministry and mission. By connecting people and sharing expertise, churches can 'see before they try' and find support and training.
