This Lent we are encouraged to wait expectantly for God to meet us and sustain us through the storms and trials we all face.

The Church of England's Lent theme for 2024 is Watch and Pray: Wisdom and hope for Lent and life.

On the night he was betrayed, Jesus kneels in darkness in the Garden of Gethsemane. Though he pleads with his disciples, "Stay here with me ... Watch and pray," they all fall asleep, leaving him alone in his hour of deepest suffering.

This Lent all of us are encouraged to draw on the wisdom of Black Spirituality, particularly the practice of "tarrying" (waiting) as a community to draw closer to Jesus and to each other. Combining exuberant singing, fervent prayer and quiet lament, such services typically take place at night and last somewhat longer than the "one hour" Jesus asked of those first followers.

This year's resources have been inspired and informed by the 2024 Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book, <u>Tarry Awhile: Wisdom from Black Spirituality for people of faith by Selina Stone</u> (SPCK). The <u>daily</u> reflections booklet for adults (CHP) exploring the same themes has been written by Carlton Turner, and there is also a daily challenge <u>booklet for children and families</u> (CHP).

Watch and Pray invites us to seek God in both familiar and unfamiliar places this Lent: in darkness and in quiet; in movement and migration; in the healing and transforming work of the Spirit; in the weeping of Holy Week and in the joy of Easter morning.

RACIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY (11th FEBRUARY 2024)

"Racial prejudice plays a dominant role in the hostile approach to refugees. Racism is at the root of the 'hostile environment' that is promoted as an official policy in our country. Therefore, on Racial Justice Sunday this year, it is appropriate that we focus on the justice dimension of our hospitality to those who are fleeing persecution. The affirmation that every human being carries the image of God regardless of their race, colour or geographical location is foundational to our Christian understanding of humanity. It is a tragic effect of our sin that a huge number among us live in poverty and conflict – which compels them to look for places of safety and security elsewhere – while many of us live in comfort and relative peace. PRAYER JOTTINGS – FEBRUARY 2024

- The second selections from Mark Oakley's 'The Collage of God' (Canterbury, 2012) and Chris Webb's 'God Soaked Life – discovering a kingdom spirituality' (Hodder, 2017).
 - In the section entitled 'The Invitation' (pp. 7-27) Chris Webb invites us 'to participate in God's community of love.' In God's purpose 'This world was to be both a place drenched in God's holy presence and a dwelling for human beings living in relationship with him and with one another. Creation, a space opened up in which we could live and flourish, was God's great act of hospitality. (Genesis 1.27). His focus is 'the formation of a magnificent, all-encompassing God-soaked loving community.... It is his sole focus, his passion, his obsession.' He calls you

Jesus never proclaimed the kingdom as a new religion ... nor was it a new religious institution ...[and] it was not a new political entity. The kingdom is formed by the God of love and community, and is intended for the least, the lost, the poor and the small. God made us for himself, and his heart is restless until it finds its rest in us. God delights in each of us – hard as that may be for some of us to believe. The life he offers 'is a life of purpose and significance and beauty. It is also a life of hardship, endeavor, suffering and tears. Will you accept his invitation or not?'

Reflect on Proverbs 8.22-31 - why might God delight in the human race?

- Mark Oakley speaks (Ch1, Hiddenness) with deep respect and affection for the late television dramatist, Dennis Potter. He reflects that belief in God 'comes out of an intuition, a sense of awe, surprise, beyondness, epiphany. It emerges from the perception that reality can somehow, ultimately, be trusted. He quotes A.S. Byatt who sees a division between 'those who are interested in the world ... and those who merely subsist, worrying or yawning.'
- The mystery of God's hiddenness, though often interpreted as such, is not closure and self-concealment but a persistent revealing of God's self for the nurture of those he loves.
 Ultimately it is the shadowing of God that draws us to the light, inspiriting our ache to be within his Kingdom.'

Both speak of the offer from God, both infer in different ways how we might respond. Surely this is at the heart of a life soaked with prayer.

Nuneaton based chaplains working with NHS Trusts include Jonathan Fryer, Liz Jones and Simon Moult. Many people in hospital can feel isolated, fearful and unsure of what the future holds. Hospital chaplains in Coventry and Warwickshire journey alongside those in pain (physical & mental) and would be pleased to hear of any patients who would appreciate pastoral care.
