Growing Leaders Enabling and equipping both new and current leaders. New growth ... as we make new disciples.

Three important roles of every diocese are to inspire people, to help them hear God's call in their own lives, and to equip them for their unique ministry. In the Diocese of Coventry we are developing our Equip Hub to provide a single point of contact for high quality learning, training and resourcing. We are populating it with locally produced resources that showcase good practice and innovation from across the diocese.

During 2022 we developed a new framework for releasing, recognising and resourcing lay ministry across the diocese. A key part of that process was a diocese-wide consultation to discern what patterns would be most helpful. In September, Bishop Christopher reviewed the survey results and approved the framework that emerged from those results.

During 2023 we will: Develop new features and resources in the Equip Hub; Start to implement a new Lay Ministries Framework. Develop a support network for ordained ministers from UKME backgrounds, and review how best to grow more leaders with UKME backgrounds. Help to prepare a larger than usual number of ordination candidates for national discernment.

The Evening Standard reported on 6 May 2023,

"The <u>Archbishop</u> of <u>Canterbury</u> has told Charles "we crown a <u>King</u> to serve" during his coronation sermon. Mr Welby spoke of how "Jesus Christ was anointed not to be served, but to serve" – adding: "The weight of the task given you today, Your Majesties, is only bearable by the spirit of God." The Archbishop also spoke of the King's priorities as monarch, including "the way we nurture and encourage the young, in the conservation of the natural world." In his short sermon, the archbishop said: "We are here to crown a King, and we crown a King to serve. "What is given today is for the gain of all."



Dan Cable, professor of organizational behavior at London Business School wrote an article for Harvard Business Review in April 2018 entitled, 'How Humble Leadership Really Works", concluding "... When leaders are humble, show respect, and ask how they can serve employees as they improve the organisation, the outcomes can be

outstanding. And perhaps even more important than better [] results, servant leaders get to act like better human beings."

PRAYING FOR THE EMERGENCE OF MORE MISSIONAL LEADERS

The Apostle Paul had a recruiting strategy for missional leaders, illustrated by the way he handled Mark, Mike Breen says,

Character – does this person have the interior life needed by someone going to the missional frontier, or at least the desire to develop it? Does he or she hear from God and respond in obedience? Does he or she follow through? Does he or she do the right thing when no one is watching?

Capacity – Does he or she have the available time in their current season of life to lead something? Is there enough space? Is he or she physically healthy? Emotionally healthy? How does he or she react under stress or when things get hard?

Chemistry – Do you like this person? Do other people like this person? Is this person reasonably good with people? Do you or others enjoy working with him or her? Do you ... want to be with this person when the pressure is on?

Calling - is he or she called to this specific work at this specific time?

PRAYER JOTTINGS – JUNE 2023

 From Tyler Staton's 'Praying Like Monks, Living Like Fools – an invitation to the Wonder and Mystery of Prayer' (Hodder & Stoughton, 2022) Chapter 4 'Our Father, Adoration' pp. 55, 66-7

"Jesus prayed differently. He honoured the common Jewish prayer rhythm, but he prayed with a sense of familiarity with God that no one had ever seen. He also prayed with a reverence that was more than cultural but was sincere and honest. His prayers were conversations, not just pleas, involving as much – probably more – listening than talking. It was in prayer that Jesus got his marching orders. Prayer was the place where his eyes were opened and his steps directed. "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing." Most distinctly, his prayers were effective. They got God's attention..... Having stilled our bodies and souls, giving God the first word, we now break the silence with adoration

Musical Worship – a melody incorporates both intellect and emotion.

Pray a Psalm – read a psalm aloud, slowly; allow a word or phrase to be a springboard for your own prayers.

Gratitude – a simple and effective form of adoration is the intentional practice of gratitude.

For many the prayer of *Examen* has provided an effective framework for gratitude.

- o Review the day with God thankful for specific details
- Invite the Holy Spirit to illuminate the day when God's presence felt nearest, and most distant
- Finally pray a simple prayer of intercession for tomorrow"
- "Wise leadership flows from contemplation. The best leaders are not busy but focused. They are not in a hurry. Getting it right is better than getting it quick. They only do what they can do. They articulate and guard the vision and values of the organization. They are faithful to it. They involve others. They trust them. They delegate and share leadership. They are prepared to be followers themselves. Their goal is the well-being of those whom they serve and achieving the goals of the organisation. Because rest, reflection and recreation are priorities, they see the big picture and they model to others a balanced and healthy lifestyle" Stephen Cotterell Hit the Ground Kneeling – Seeing Leadership Differently (Church House Publishing, 2008)

- God marvelously, miraculously, cares about each and every one of us ... And so God says to you, "I love you. You are precious in your fragility and your vulnerability. Your being is a gift. Desmond Tutu, in God Has a Dream – a Vision of Hope for our Time (Rider, 2005).
- Charles Burgess, for CPAS in March 2023, says that one of the key aspects of Jesus's life and work was "the deepest, intentional abiding with the Father. The relationship from which all else flows." "My sense is that the last ten years is part of an ongoing, gradual shift from a more directive style to one with a stronger relational emphasis in which vulnerability and empathy are key in connecting well and building trust. In large part this reflects a wider societal shift, but the language and tone also reflects a changing missional climate in which 'the givens' of the past basic biblical and Christian knowledge, for example have changed significantly, even among Christians." He looks ahead to the next ten years

He asks "Which leadership skill would you most like to improve in the year ahead? How may you enable this to happen?

- Churches transformed by leaders embracing emotionally healthy spirituality (EHS) include,
 - Slowed Down Spirituality including time in solitude and silence
 - Integrity in leadership leadership out of a deep interior life with Christ
 - Beneath the Surface Discipleship we maintain a profound awareness of and appreciation for our brokenness
 - *Healthy Community* we affirm and practice deep listening as an indispensable means of loving others well
