Growing Leaders - growing numbers of leaders equipped for mission focused ministry

"Three important roles of every diocese are to inspire people, to help them hear God's call in their own lives, and to equip them for their unique ministry."

Last month, Bishop Ruth awarded the first 'Bishop's Certificates' to affirm those people who have completed one of our Lay Training Pathways. There are many more to follow. Our Pathways offer a programme of practical training, focused learning, and personal formation for Christian people who are growing into a variety of forms of ministry and leadership.

Presently, Coventry Diocese offers six Lay Training Pathways, which anyone can join if recommended by their 'vicar'. The Pathways are: Bereavement Ministry; Children's, Youth & Family Ministry; Leading Worship; Pastoral Ministry; Preaching; and Reconciliation. Those following a pathway benefit from meeting other lay leaders from across the diocese as well as teaching and training from experienced leaders.

The overall desire of the programme is to recognise, resource and release the ministry of Christian people who offer service and leadership in the churches of Coventry Diocese.

Urgency – our world demands instant responses. A healthy leader will give priority to the important, not just respond to the urgent.

Dependency – many want leaders to give them answers ... more often a coaching style response will lead to greater long-term health.

Heroism – giving attention to one individual is rarely healthy. A secure, self-aware leader will always be pointing away from themselves and developing teams.

Availability — effective connection and communication ... is not the same as constant availability. A healthy leader will set flexible but firm boundaries ...

Looking Back – congregations have very long memories ... it is seductive to think we are more capable than our predecessors, but this is a trap to avoid

Does your exercise of ministry bring you personal growth, freedom and renewal? Are you becoming more creative and resourceful, or does ministerial leadership simply exhaust you?

Pray for clergy wellbeing

There was some recovery since the pandemic in mental, physical, and vocational wellbeing [of clergy], but financial wellbeing decreased since 2021 and relationship wellbeing (measured in terms of isolation) continued to fall.

Stipendiary incumbents fared particularly badly, seeing no recovery in any aspect of wellbeing; low rates of mental health; and widespread financial difficulties associated partly with the cost-of-living crisis.

Respondents under the age of 40 were more likely to struggle financially and also to report higher levels of emotional exhaustion and depersonalization (two dimensions of burnout).

PRAYER JOTTINGS – JUNE 2024

Extracts from The Collage of God (Mark Oakley) – Ch 4 Truthfulness - and God Soaked Life-Discovering a Kingdom Spirituality (Chris Webb) – Ch 5 God In Everyday Life –

From Mark Oakley, 'Through listening to each other's words we deepen our awareness of each other, the worlds which it possible to inhabit, the truths which necessarily contribute to our own understanding of Truth (p.52).' 'I see the need for a spirit concerned to ensure that the Church keeps a breadth of mind, a general courtesy in its communal life, a desire to defend another's right of speech and interpretation of shared texts and maintains a greater concern to check its own prejudices than preserve its so-called 'purity' (p. 56)'.

From Chris Webb, 'Everywhere Jesus looked he saw the hidden spiritual world opening itself up to view through the ordinary, the mundane, the everyday: wine at a wedding, salt in the kitchen, water drawn from the well, leaven kneaded into bread dough ... the kingdom, it turns out, can be seen everywhere. The question is, do we have eyes to see it.?' (p. 109) 'Really seeing is difficult and takes time How hard might it be to see a storm, a river, a sunset – let alone another person?' (p. 112) He goes on to describe how some of us are more people focused, others task focused, while he is more ideas focused. (p. 114) Really seeing people takes 'deliberate, intentional effort and a lot of practice.... Truly seeing people springs from a hospitality of the soul' (p. 115).

Listening carefully (Oakey), really seeing people (Webb) – both are encouraging us to learn attentiveness (Webb, pp. 117-123). Inevitably, Webb introduces *examen*, which is a way of weighing the events of our day, and can help us 'hone our spiritual attention.'

Where today have I experienced loving community? Where have I experienced the loss of love and community?

Being ourselves

When we think about growing leaders we can sometimes focus on skills and information that we need to develop in another. But leaders are much more than just the gifts they have or the skills they acquire. As we grow leaders we also need to help them explore how their passions, personality and experiences are part of how and what they lead. This is because our being and our history helps to shape who we become. God uses the whole of who we are, so we

should join in and help people grow in the wholeness of who God made them in the spaces that God is calling them to.

As we take time to reflect and pray on growing leaders this month. Perhaps create space for God to speak into how you notice and grow leaders around you?
