ECO CHURCH

Thankful! Compared with last year, we now have 25 Silver level accredited churches and 72 Bronze level. This is growth from 14 Silver and 58 bronze level churches and reflects the considerable energy, enthusiasm and commitment that is evident amongst our local churches.

We're delighted that in April 25, several more churches have registered with or achieved accreditation with the <u>EcoChurch</u> initiative operated by A Rocha (the top Christian Conservation charity in the UK).

This now means we have reached the Silver criterion threshold for the number of registered and awarded churches for the Silver Eco Diocese award.



Further work at the Diocesan office should secure this award by 2026.



ALL SAINTS, BEDWORTH

In support of our Net Zero Carbon 2030 Commitment to cut emissions, we thank God that the work amongst churches is gathering pace. Amongst the highlights is the award of Demonstrator Church status for All Saints Church, Bedworth.



Despite initial opposition, this Listed church secured planning consent to install a rooftop array of 50 Solar PV panels to generate renewable energy. Their work was completed in December and is already reducing energy bills, subsidizing the cost of running the busy community café and other activities. The church is sharing their learning points widely and helping other churches on their Net Zero journey.

DIOCESAN ENVIRONMENTAL REPRESENTATIVES

Jacqueline is active in her local church in Tysoe and shared her active interest in floristry at the recent Diocesan Eco Church evening. Debbie Cooke (Coventry East) gave a great account of Eco Churches and their positive impact on their local communities on Zero Interest, our Net Zero podcast series which is available via Spotify. Rev Charlotte Jackson (Coventry North) is helping the DBF Property team to evaluate low carbon technology, part of a Net Zero pilot programme, in clergy homes. Dean Moore (Nuneaton) brings his considerable experience on forestry alongside the Churchyard Biodiversity and Heritage project in Coventry City churches. Dr Katie Hartless-Rose (Fosse) brings a great awareness of all the Edgehill churches and her deanery – she hopes she can, "encourage the smaller rural churches in the deanery who are not sure how to tackle eco church and the footprint tool into completing them."

This month's deanery focus is on **Coventry South**. It's great that **Caring for God's Creation** is central to the mission and vision of so many of our churches in this deanery. Five of these churches have achieved Silver level accreditation and two have Bronze level. Three more are working towards their awards. We've highlighted in this Prayer Diary our hope of recruiting Deanery Environmental Representatives (DERs) in Coventry South, as well as in Southam and in Warwick & Leamington deaneries.

In another exciting development, five churches in Coventry South are joining in with the **Coventry Diocesan Churchyard Biodiversity and Heritage project**. With over 70 churches across the diocese; this exciting project has secured significant external funding in its development year, with the prospect of securing further funding for another five years 'broadening community engagement to management churchyards as green space.'

The Energy Footprint Tool

Praise God for the growth in engagement with the **Energy Footprint Tool**: 74% churches across the diocese completed their returns in 2024. This helps all of us to determine how much is spent on energy and where to focus resources on reducing waste. Please note that 2024 use details are to be input as a Parish Return by 30th June 2025, slightly earlier than for last year.

The diocese has **grant funding available** to churches, to strengthen our ability to reach net zero carbon emissions. As mentioned, All Saints Church in Bedworth received significant grant funds. Their eco-lead has started *Churches seeking Net Zero* as a Facebook community page. Six other local churches have accessed Net Zero Quick Wins funding from the diocese, enabling them to invest in infrastructure upgrades, added insulation, secondary glazing and LED lighting systems. Combined with better controls, these measures will reduce carbon emissions whilst also helping churches to save energy and money. **The Grants Committee** will be meeting on 24th June, there are currently two Net Zero applications that are scheduled to be considered if the technical reviews go well.
