CONNECTING WITH BIRDSONG IN MAY. Adam Nicholson, one of the great contemporary writers on birds has just published '<u>Bird School: A beginner in the Wood</u>' (Collins, 2025), a marvellous description of his studies of the birds near his home in Sussex. He got to know the birds (in great depth. Recall Jesus's words, urging us to 'Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?' (Matthew 6.24) Consider how you might listen more attentively to different birdsongs in your garden or on walks, this month.



EMERGING NEW WORSHIPPING COMMUNITIES, INCLUDE

Expressions of church that take place outdoors, such as Messy Church, Muddy Church and Forest Church, gardens and churchyards that become the focus for worship across different seasons.

Some new worshipping communities are located in our schools, or form around choirs in different ways.

New worshipping communities emerge amongst ethnically diverse groups connected with existing church buildings.
