
Why are we promoting Net Zero?

Climate Anxiety?

70% of adults in Great Britain are worried about the impact of climate change.

43% felt anxious about the future of the environment during the month before they were surveyed.

Women are more likely than men to worry about the impact of climate change.

Those over the age of 70 are less likely to report being very worried (24%) than those aged 25-34 years (34%).

Net Zero – small steps

Net Zero loan equipment being borrowed constantly through heating seasons (schools and churches)

36 church Energy Audits obtained two more due in 2025 – all fully funded.

Extension of Capacity Grant from Archbishops Council for Net Zero posts in the dioceses

extended to June 2026 (plus an indication of 2026 to 2028.)

Surge in Q4 NZ grant applications from churches

keen to implement Quick Wins and other decarbonisation proposals

... we now have a strong national network of Net Zero Officers leading this work across dioceses and cathedrals...'




2024 Carbon emissions (Gross)

2023 returns were

1,897 (403) churches* 1,070 clergy homes 74 cathedral 24 (11) DBF office

* 74% EFT return rate

What is the DBF's response for 2026?

Extended Capacity Grant Net Zero funding is until June DBF to sustain NZC-PO for the remainder of 2026.

Net Zero Grant for churches £100k plus fundraising support for external grants

Clergy Homes Net Zero Quick Wins £115k Expected to fund works in 40 homes

External Quick Wins fund likely to be £98k (£32.8k/yr over three years)

Launch of Creation Care Steering Group incorporating Biodiversity in Churchyards, Diocesan Environment Officer and Net Zero activities
